STATE HORSESHOES

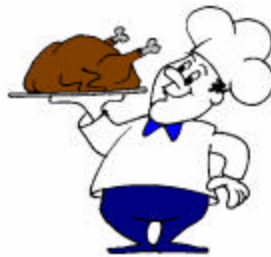
